### Track and Field at Summer Games

The sun was shining and so were the athletes and coaches at the 2009 Summer Games competition in Towson, as they wore their new yellow St. Mary's County shirts for the first time. In track and field, athletes competed in three events and a relay from the field of 25, 50, 100, 200, and 400 meter runs, the throwing events of shotput, mini javelin, and softball, running, standing, and high jumps, and relays.

Athlete Larry Mills set a new state record for shotput at 11.99 meters. He is one of 5 pentathlon athletes from St. Mary's who compete for points in 5 different events – the shotput, long jump, high jump, 400 meter and 100 meter races. Other pentathlon athletes are Thomas Smith, Terrel Nowlin, Jeremy Toney, and Wayne Carter. Wayne and Jeremy are our newest Pent athletes and are obviously picking up some great skills from the older athletes.

Many of our male athletes came home with gold medals including RJ Axtell, Casey Chappelear, Matt Dobson, Carlos Jackson, and Avery Long who had the longest running long jump of the day on Sunday. Athlete Joey Owens won gold, as did Jeremy Shores. Shawn Somerville, Donnell Thompson, Justin Thompson, Moses Weaver, Issac Wieser. Bronze medalists include Brandon Chan, Ray Cusick, Jim Downs, Jerry Gatton, George Mattingly, and Charlie Sayers. Other track and field athletes who competed at the Summer Games include Bill Ford, Timmy Menard, and Joseph Williams.

Several of the relay teams came home with gold medals including Karla Kless/Trisha Baynard/Vicki Trossbach/Jeffery Hagen in the 4 x 100 meter, Kristin Klear/Michelle Haley/Scarlet Cundiff/Michelle Johnson running the 4 x 100 relay, Toney/Kegan Zimmerman/Samantha Oliver/Chris Gibson winning their 4 x 100 relay.

Coach Don Bewick commented on

the girls domination in their events: Emoni Butler won the Gold medal in the 400 meter and 200 meter with the best times of the competition --30 seconds for the 200 and 1 minute 16 for the 400. Tanesha Davis won her 100 m race with a time of 13.7 (fastest female time of the day). Samantha Oliver won a very close 100 meter race with a great time of 14.1, her fastest time for the season. Other gold medal girls include Shelby Boyer, Angela Buckler, Parish Butler, and Amanda Lowe. Also winning gold were Kennedy McReynolds, Desi Ogden, plus Angela Pitts and Amy Trowbridge who both had impressive distances in the Mini-Jav. Bronze medalists include Melody Chase, Ann Marie Fanzo, Laura Marini, April Newton.

Long time coach Joe Owens was not able to attend the competition this year and Coach Bewick commended Lisa Owens on stepping in as acting head coach and doing a great job in her dad's absence. The athletes enjoyed the weekend at the University and the coaches and volunteers did a great job of getting everyone to where they needed to be during the busy schedule of events.

The St. Mary's County program is grateful for the support of Great Mills High School for their track use for weekly practices. A special thanks to the coaches, volunteers, and family members who worked so hard to make this a wonderful event for our athletes.
