St. Mary's Athletes Rock & Roll in Nebraska



Twenty-one athletes and partners and a half dozen coaches travelled to the middle of the country to represent Maryland at the Special Olympics National's competition at U of Nebraska in Lincoln. Joined by several family members, the St. Mary's delegation enjoyed the competition, facilities, new friendships and the food! Swimmer Kyle Russell came home with two bronze medals, a silver and gold in his 50 meter backstroke. The basketball team included Jim Downs, Brandon Chan, Tiffaney Johnson, Robert King, Avery Long, Terrell Nowlin, Joe Quade, Daniel Simpson, and Brandon Thompson. Competition in their division was fierce but the team took on the challenge with the utmost sportsmanship. Head Coach Bewick commented, "Our athletes were true sports. They knew the other teams were strong but they didn't give up." The team came home with a 4th place award and an inspiring memory.

In bowling, Kegan Zimmerman and his fellow Marylanders competed in singles, doubles, and a 4-person team. Kegan won the bronze medal in singles, 4th in doubles, and 5th in team play. "My family was able to watch the progress of each match on the internet. That was really great," commented Kegan. The bowlers received an authentic bowling pin adorned with the 2010 National logo.

Unified Volleyball team members were Julie Coombs, Kelly Graves, Sam Huffman, Larry Mills, Samantha Oliver, Shaun Ridley, Kara Sapp, Thomas Smith, Steven Summerfelt, Wil Ridley .The team played against teams from Texas, Minnesota, North Dakota, Oklahoma, and Connecticut, winning all of their preliminary games. In the gold medal round, they played a very experienced team from Texas. They split the first two games of the match. They went into the tie-breaker and lost to Texas, 16-14. A Special Olympics official at the event commented, "This was an incredible unified team. They played together and used the proper technique of volleyball. It was a pleasure to watch."

St. Mary's County Captures 3 Top Honors at the State Level

Don Bewick was voted SOMD Volunteer of the Year. He supports all facets of SO St. Mary's County. By trade, Don is a Navy test engineer. His job is complex and often requires travel. He arranges his return flights from his work to get back in time to help with the monthly Poker Tournament fundraiser. He moves tables, coordinates players, calculates winnings and stays until 1 or 2 a.m. when the tournament ends.

Don does not have a family member in the Special Olympics program, he just gives of himself to help anyone in need. Last September he helped with cycling on Saturday mornings, walking beside new athletes learning to ride and navigate, and helping with bowling in the afternoon as the primary volunteer on the wheelchair ramp lane. In November he ran in the 5K Prediction Race, another fundraiser for St. Mary's. In January, he trained to be a basketball coach and his team won gold in their division and went on to attend the 2010 National Games. In spring, he was a track coach, preparing 100 athletes to compete in Spring Games, with several going on to compete at the Summer Games.

Don helped to prepare4 young men for the Penn Relay race. They practiced extra evenings for this prestigious event and came home with first place. Don not only was their coach, he also took off from work and drove the athletes to the competition.

During this time, Don also redesigned a new web site for St. Mary's. Don is there, at every fundraiser, at almost every sport, and at any time when we need muscle to move equipment. His kind and gentle spirit, coupled with his dedication to training and sports, makes Don a magnificent volunteer. He has become part of our Special Olympics family and we are grateful for his volunteerism.

The sun was shining and so were the athletes at the 40th Anniversary

Special Olympics Maryland Summer Games at Towson University.

In track and field, athletes competed in three events and a relay from the field of 50, 100, 200, 400, and 800 meter runs and walks; the throwing events of shotput, mini javelin, and softball; and running, standing, and high jumps.

New coach Gary Ridosh supported the efforts of three athletes who entered the 800 meter race this year: Moses Weaver, Emoni Butler, and Brandon Chan. All three made a great showing in their individual divisions: Emoni won first, Moses won second, and Brandon won third. Athletes Larry Mills, Thomas Smith, Terrel Nowlin, Avery Long, and Wayne Carter competed as pentathlon athletes, competing in a total of five events each. Coach Lloyd Grayson commented on these athletes' performances, "Each athlete scored their personal best in at least one of their events. We are very proud of them."

A remarkable happening of the games was the opportunity for Jerry Gatton, a blind individual, to run the 50 meter race without holding on to a rope, rather he listened to the voice of Head Coach Owens in front of him to guide him in his lane. After the race, Jerry was overcome with joy and said, "I felt free for the first time."
