Winter Games is Exciting Event

Hundreds of Special Olympics Maryland athletes, coaches and volunteers took part in the 2013 Winter Games, held at Whitetail Resort in Mercersburg, PA, on February 25-26, 2013. The two days of competition included events for alpine skiers and snowshoe athletes and the results are in.

Alpine skiing included events for novice, intermediate and advanced levels across twelve different events. Snowshoeing included thirteen different events, between both individual races and relays.

Special Olympics athletes from St. Mary's County competed in Alpine Skiing and Snowshoe at SOMD's 2013 Winter Games. Skier Kayla Woolridge competed in the novice category on a monoski. She skied independently through the gates. Thirteen counties competed in addition to ours: Allegany, Anne Arundel, Baltimore City, Carroll, Cecil, Charles, Frederick, Garrett, Harford, Howard, Lower Shore, Montgomery, and Washington.

Kayaking and golf will begin practices in late July with State competitions tentatively set for the end of September. There was some talk of moving kayaking back to a summer sport, but as of right now it is scheduled for the fall. If this changes we will let you know!

This year's state tournament was held at the Fall Sports Festival in Emmitsburg, MD, specifically at the Federal Emergency Management Association facility.

The scenic tree-lined driveways became the venue for intense

cycling competition. Each athlete participated in two events. The athletes made their coaches proud.

Golf Athletes Excel at State Tournament

Blue Mash Golf Course in Olney hosted the Special Olympics State Golf Skills Competition on September 29.

"The athletes all played at the top of their game, showing off some of their best shots of the year," remarked Coach Joe Feehan. Along with Cabott Cashwell and Butch Kious, Feehan trained the golfers in skills at Wicomico Shores Golf Course. April Towler and Keith Stamp received gold medals and Charles Windsor, as a

first year golfer, placed fourth.

"Throughout the competition they cheered each other on and at the end of the day, they all celebrated each other's accomplishments," noted Feehan. Also training all season at

Wicomico were level 2 and 3 athletes. They competed in the State Competition on September 30 at the Chesapeake Bay Golf Club North East. Level 2 play consists of nine hole rounds with alternating shots by a Special Olympics athlete and a partner. Competing in level 2 were Joey Owens and Brian Tierney (Silver Medal), Russell Bucci and Paul Guy (Bronze Medal) and Andrew Gill and Paul Rambish (4th). Eighteen holes of golf with alternate

shots by athlete and partner were played by level 3 team Jimmy Hawkins and Bill Lowe placing them in first with a score of 97. With that effort they achieved their personal best score at the state competitions.



Kayaking Moves to a Fall Season Sport

After ten weeks of training at Greenwell State Park and regional qualifiers in Chestertown, the kayak team finished the season with an abbreviated State Competition in Sykesville on October 6th. With the exception of Kyle Russell's gold medal performance in the top division of the 500 meter race and Rebecca Elwell's silver medal 500 meter race, windy weather limited the competition to 100 meter races. New athlete Kennedy McReynolds and returning kayaker Isaac Weiser won gold medals in their races. The duo of athlete Brady Carrigan and partner Brian Hartz won gold in their unified race. Receiving silver medals were Joshua Fondren, Michelle Johnson, Karla Kless and Jeremy Degler. Visually impaired athlete April Mielcarek came home with a gold medal, racing solo in a traditional kayak with a "shadow" kayak next to her giving her instructions to stay on course.

This was the second year in a row Special Olympic teams competed in the NIRSA (National Intramural Recreational Sports Association) flag football regional championships. The NIRSA event was primarily organized and executed by college students, and the officials were college students -which qualified it as a NIRSA event.

Special Olympics teams competed at University of Maryland and Southern Illinois University. Two teams from Maryland, and one team each from Cape Code, Mass, and Charlotte, NC completed. Saturday events were played to qualify for Sunday.

Several good plays were made by our athletes. Kegan Zimmerman and Sam Huffman scored multiple touchdowns and Brandon Chan played well at his first time playing QB. Saturday was capped off in an all-star game in which Avery Long and Larry Mills played with and against other Special Olympic athletes and University of Maryland students on the turf fields

under the lights. Both Avery and Larry scored and threw for touchdowns.

On Sunday St. Mary's played the college students. After taking a two touchdown lead including a long pass by Avery to Thomas Smith, the Maryland students fought back and took a 1 -point lead. Larry scored the go-ahead touchdown on a long run from a reverse in the final two minutes. Shaun Ridley made the final defensive play to secure the win.

Overall, a great game! Special Olympic athletes and the college students all had a great time. Thanks to Special Olympics Maryland's Sam Hodapp and Melissa Kelly; SO International and the U of Maryland Intramural Sport Department staff and students for a great experience.

The athletes picked up the game really well, and for the most part called their own plays and took charge.

In addition to making a lot of great memories on the field, the Flag Football team traveled to the University of Delaware for the Seventh Annual Pig Skin Pass -- a fifty-eight mile relay run on November 3rd.

Bowling Season is a Success

This year's bowling season was record-setting — it attracted 98 weekly bowlers, 42 regional bowlers, and 21 bowlers who competed at the state level.

Esperanza Bowling Lanes opened its doors weekly from August through October to 98 local bowlers. This is a very popular sport in St. Mary's and often attracts new athletes to Special Olympics. This year, several athletes were new to Bowling and to Special Olympics.

Forty-two local bowlers traveled to Glen Burnie to compete in Maryland's Southern Regional tournament. Our athletes participated in singles and doubles, as well as a few unified double partners. The facility was huge, containing 46 lanes and each were filled with athletes form St. Mary's, Charles, Calvert, Prince George's, and Anne Arundel counties. All athletes who achieved a first or second in this competition were invited to the State Bowling Tournament.

Twenty-one St. Mary's athletes attended the state event on December 3 at Bowl America in Gaithersburg. Again, the facility was huge and filled with competitors from the entire state. St. Mary's representatives did well.
